Your pharmacy benefits grace period ends **April 1, 2026**. Avoid interruptions in medication coverage by reviewing these key changes:

What You Need to Do:

- **Check Your Medications:** If you take high-cost drugs or those needing prior authorization (PA)
- **Contact Your Doctor:** Ask them to submit prior authorization (PA) requests through **PromptPA**.

Grace Period Ending Soon



The grace period for your pharmacy benefits is ending. To avoid interruptions in your medication coverage, please review the upcoming changes taking effect **April 1, 2026**.

What is changing?

After April 1, 2026, two key updates will apply to your pharmacy plan:

- **Formulary Update:** Your plan will fully adopt the **2026 ESI National Preferred Formulary**.
- **High-Dollar Claim Reviews:** Non-Specialty Medications costing over **\$1,000** for a **30-day** supply will require a Prior Authorization (PA) review.

Immediate Action

If you take a high-cost medication or a drug that requires authorization under the new formulary, you must act now to ensure you can refill your prescription after April 1.

- **Be Proactive:** Do not wait until you are out of medication.
- **Contact Your Doctor:** Alert your prescriber immediately that they may need to submit an updated Prior Authorization request.

Instructions For Your Doctor

When asking your doctor to submit a Prior Authorization, please give them this specific instruction:

- **STOP:** Do NOT use CoverMyMeds or other PA portal
- **GO:** Submit all PA requests through **PromptPA** (RxBenefits).

Using the correct portal ensures your review is processed quickly and prevents delays at the pharmacy counter.
